ANNUAL REPORT OF ACTIVITIES Highlights of 2016

Administrative Activities

EKHC Partnership.

- During the previous year EKHC underwent some government- required restructuring to separate itself entirely from the Church. It was re-named the EKHC Development Commission (EKHCDC); it has a new Board and new admin staff. The Commissioner is Simon Haile. Bereket Gebretsion, the Director of WASH and Public Health Programs, is our primary contact. Yohannes Demisse continues to be WASH Coordinator. Bereket is an excellent communicator. Although leadership of their organization has changed, our partnership with EKHCDC remains strong, based on mutual trust and commitment to the mission.
- Bob and Dagim visited Ethiopia in February, 2016, to attend a celebration of the new water system in Jejiga Village. They also visited other villages with whom HORCO has worked in previous years, going back to 2012. Everything was working well. Our reputation and that of EKHCDC is growing in the Gimbichu District, as was expressed in conversation with Emishaw, the District Water Officer. A memorable visit was also made to the village where work will be done in 2016/17, where we were unexpectedly invited to join a farmer and his family for a special lunch of roast sheep. A full report is on file.
- After several iterations, a 2-year budget was approved for a large water/sanitation project with the Menjigso Gora Villages in 2016/17.
- HORCO received interim project updates and financial summaries (on file) throughout the year, as required in our agency agreement. An official 2016 audit by Ethiopian Auditors has been received (summary page attached).

Charitable Activities

HORCO's charitable activities in 2016 consisted of partnering with EKHCDC and the Menjigso Gora Villages to complete the first half of the 2-year project which, when completed by the end of 2017, will bring clean water and sanitation to about 1,500 people. A previously existing well was fitted with a new pump (provided by the Villages) and generator (provided by the Ethiopian Government) to pump clean water into a new 27,000 L reservoir. The reservoir will feed a number of new water points located as far

away as 7 km, by regulated gravity flow. In 2016, pipe was laid and water points were constructed for 3 of the 6 planned water points in the Villages. Other water points were completed for the near-by elementary school and the healthcare clinic. Clothes washing tables and livestock troughs will also be built as part of the clean water system. Sanitation and personal hygiene were taught in small groups throughout the year. Families were taught how to make a sanitary pit latrine, and a high percentage of families actually did so. A community sanitation team was established to continue training and monitoring of sanitary practices. HORCO provided approximately \$57,000 for this phase of the project Menjigso Gora project. 
Fund-raising

- 2017 Project. Discussions regarding a project and budget for 2016 began in October, 2015, and continued through December. The proposed project was with the Menjigso Gora Villages; it was a large project with a significantly higher budget than HORCO has funded previously. After discussion it was agreed that the project would be done over two-years, and we settled on a total budget of 1,582,455 ET Birr (\$105,147 CAD), with sub-totals of 935,675 ET Birr (\$62,171 CAD) and 646,180 ET Birr (\$42,975 CAD) for 2016 and 2017, respectively.
- Ethiopian Dinner. We held our 9th annual fund-raising event, *In Celebration of Clean Water*, on November 5th, which was an Ethiopian dinner similar to those served each year since 2008. The event was held at Oakridge Presbyterian Church in London. Besides the popular Ethiopian food, the evening featured an interview with Roslynn Norman and her daughter, Claire, who has a passion for raising money for HORCO to help children in Ethiopia. Claire's personal fund-raising total was almost \$1,600. Total donations to what is known as "Claire's Well" by the Norman Family and their friends totaled almost \$10,000. We also had new photos and several video interviews from HORCO's visit to Ethiopia in February, 2016. The London Amabile Boys Training Choir performed (free-of-charge), much to the delight of the guests.
 - ➤ The event had 200 seated guests plus about 25 volunteers. London's Ethiopian Community provided help with the event, and donated 200 injera for the meal. Ethiopian food was purchased from the ENAT Restaurant in London.
 - Sponsorships by the Sansin Corporation (\$4,000), Quench Water Canada Inc (\$960) covered much of the cost of the event.
 - The total money raised from ticket sales (\$3,750) and donors (77) at the dinner was \$20,962.

Summary of all donations.

In addition to donations received at the dinner, HORCO also received donations online (CanadaHelps), directly in person, or through the mail. Most of the donations came in response to the mail/email request in the fall, although > \$900 comes in each month from monthly donors (CanadaHelps).



- The dinner continues to attract the greatest number of donors
- Online donations and dinner donations were about equal
- ➤ Direct donations accounted for half of the revenue this includes corporate sponsors and qualified donors (churches)
- ➤ 43% (68) of the donors were new; 16% (25) of donors gave almost 80% of the total donations

Financial Report

We are pleased to report as shown below that 89% of HORCO's disbursements in 2016 were used to support charitable activities in Ethiopia. **Details of 2016 finances are attached (***Appendices B and C***).** The 2016 records and reports of HORCO were reviewed by Mr. R. James Connelly, C.A. His letter and summary report will be available at the AGM. This is not a formal audit, but rather an "audit engagement" by a qualified accountant. Ontario Corporations with revenues <\$100,000 per year are not required to have formal audits if Board Members agree that an audit engagement is sufficient to provide accountability for financial dealings of the corporation. Mr. Connelly donated his time and expertise to complete this review.

Note: The 2015 deficit of ET Birr 85,284 (~\$5,000 CAD) was attributed to some disputed charges not in the original budget. We called this to their attention in early 2016, and EKHCDC made adjustments to our expenses in 2016, essentially eliminating the disputed charges in 2015, i.e. the 2016 expenses were reduced by almost ET Birr 85,000. The 2016 year-end deficit was ET Birr 2,158 (~\$140 CAD). Average exchange CAD vs ET Birr for 2016 = 15-16.
